Zhao Zhong is an experienced grassroots leader who now helps Pacific Environment's local partners in China fight water pollution as our new Beijing-based China program coordinator.

Recognized as one of TIME Magazine's Heroes of the Environment in 2009, Zhao Zhong founded Green Camel Bell, the first environmental organization in Gansu province in northwestern China, in 2003. Under his leadership, Green Camel Bell became one of China's most respected and effective water pollution watchdogs, successfully pressuring factories that dump waste and toxins into the Yellow River to clean up their act.
